This is a project from the book *Advanced Projects in Woodwork* by Ira S. Griffith © 1912. The book is now in the public domain and can be found at Archive.Org.

The book was created to teach woodworking skills to high school students of the time. Honestly, if my shop teacher had presented this book to me in shop class, I'd have been much more attentive.


The projects in the book are in the Arts & Crafts or Mission style. This Book Stand is a great example of the style. It has blind dado joints as well as through-tenons with mitered edges for accent.

It also has the pointed arches that are so familiar in the style. The vertical edges of its sides are angled for their full length. The stand holds the books in a standard bookshelf position. The shelves follow the angle of the sides retaining a consistent recess.


This is an exciting project for an advanced high school woodworker.
